**The music:** 2023 has seen an outpouring of love for one of Britain's finest ever composers – William Byrd. However, 1623 also saw the death of another really fine, and more obviously emotional composer, Thomas Weelkes. Stories abound as to his behaviour, and his music has some quite extraordinary texts and backgrounds. The sessions will include singing led by Will Dawes, and historical background and context led by Dr Katie Bank. Music will include "When David heard", "Hosanna to the Son of David", "As Vesta was" and "Thule, the period of cosmosgraphy".

**All voices,** from high soprano to low bass, are very welcome.

Acceptance is subject to musical balance, so please apply early.

Music will be emailed as PDFs to print out and bring with you. If you can't do this, we will be able to provide printed scores if you ask well in advance.

**Will Dawes** is a Choral Director and Baritone. He is Director of Chapel Music at Somerville College, Oxford. For 16 years he was a member of Stile Antico and he has also sung with The Sixteen, The Cardinall's Musick and the Gabrieli Consort.



**Katie Bank** is Leverhulme Early Career Fellow in the Department of History at the University of Birmingham. She is webmaster and creator of ByrdCentral.com, a collaborative initiative celebrating the quartercentenary of Byrd's death, but she mostly writes about Weelkes.
