Musíc for two Marys

Workshop directed by **Patrick Craig** For voices and suitable instruments **Saturday 12th November 2022**

10.30 am — 5.15 pm at Bosham Village Hall (nr. Chichester) PO18 8QF

In this workshop Patrick will delve into some of the less well-known repertoire surrounding Mary Magdalen and Mary the Mother of Jesus. Including music by Guerrero, Croce, and Lassus, he will explore the many titles and myths attached to these contrasting female figures from the New Testament, as well as trying to get to the heart of their core stories as Mother to Jesus and the first witness to the Resurrection. This live workshop stands alone, while also building on Patrick's recent Zoom talk for SEMF on the music, art, and theology surrounding the mysterious figures of the two Marys.

The music: Subject to the forces available, Patrick hopes to include the following: Guerrero: *Lauda Mater Ecclesia* and *Maria Magdalena*; Victoria: *Ave Maria a 8*; Palestrina: *Missa de Beata Virgine a6 (Gloria)*; Lassus: *Magnificat Perpulchrum*; and Croce: *Dialogo de Choro di Angeli a 10.*

Suitable for singers plus the following instruments: strings (viol & violin families; plucked strings playing from score), lower recorders (especially Bass or GB) and other "soft wind". If in doubt, please ask. Acceptance will be subject to musical balance. *Players* who are prepared to sing for part of the time will be particularly welcome. Pitch A=440.

Instrumental parts will be provided on the day. Singers will be emailed PDF scores to print out and bring with them. If you can't do this, we can provide a limited number of copies "at cost" if you ask in advance.



Patrick Craig is a countertenor, conductor, and lecturer. He is a longtime Vicar Choral at St Paul's Cathedral, and a member of the award-winning *The Cardinall's Musick*. He also sang a thousand concerts with the Tallis Scholars over twenty years. He regularly leads workshops for Early Music Fora and Lacock Courses, and lectures for the Arts Society across the country. He founded and conducts his own all-female professional choir Aurora Nova who this year celebrate twenty-five years of singing services in St Paul's Cathedral. Recent highlights have included conducting his first Spem in alium at the Lichfield Festival, his conducting debut at the Proms, and a workshop on Biber's Missa Salisburgensis at Thaxted.
