Advent is a season of hope and expectation. These days its penitential nature is too often forgotten in the headlong flurry of festive excitement, but for Renaissance composers the poetic liturgy of 'waiting and watching' inspired powerful and evocative music.

Spend a day sheltering from commercialism with music by Taverner, Tallis and Byrd. While the precise repertoire depends upon the forces signing up, it is hoped to include several of Byrd's Propers for Advent from the Gradualia I (1605), including the spine-tingling Ave Maria, along with Thomas Tallis's Audivi vocem.

Please book early – especially tenors - to enable David to plan the music. Numbers will be limited, and acceptance is dependent on musical balance.

Workshop fee: £13 for members of SEMF and other EMFs. Age 25 & under £5. Non-members £19. *The deadline for applications is Friday 15th November.* Late bookings (*if accepted*) attract a £4 *surcharge*.

David Allinson will be well known to SEMF members – and to others who enjoy singing Renaissance music. He is Musical Director of the Renaissance Singers (London), leads his own vocal ensemble, Cantores, and sustains a lively freelance career, specialising in the history and performance of Renaissance choral music. David has directed numerous workshops and summer schools in the UK and the continent; this will be his seventeenth workshop for SEMF – and the first to be held outside Kent.

From 2013-2019 David was Director of Music at Canterbury Christ Church University; before that he was Teaching Fellow in Music at Bristol University. David is an Honorary Vice President of SEMF.
