# Renaissance workshop for instruments – three faces of Italy

Workshop at 440 for instruments directed by Emily White Sunday 30 April 2023 Normandy Village Hall

The workshop will show three faces of 17<sup>th</sup> century sacred music. The Italian style with Claudio Monteverdi, the Italian influence with Heinrich Schütz, and the Italian style with a difference with Isabella Leonarda. Leonarda grew up in a convent from adolescence, and lived through the plague of 1630 that took so many musicians: this gave her music its own unique style.

We will explore these works: Nisi Dominus from the Marian Vespers by Monteverdi; Ich Freu Mich by Schutz, and Laudate Pueri by Leonarda.

### Open to the following instruments:

Cornetts, sackbuts, curtals/dulcians, recorders, viol and violin family, plucked continuo. *Violin family players do not need to have a baroque instrument.* 

Copies of parts will be available on the day. Please bring a stand. **Pitch** is A=440.

**Fee:** £16.00 for members of SEMF and other Fora and £22.00 for non-members.

Emily is a member of The English Cornett & Sackbut Ensemble (ECSE), who play internationally and are especially known for their collaborations with vocal ensembles such as I Fagiolini.
