Baroque workshop for voices and instruments – choruses from the B minor Mass

Workshop at A440 for voices and instruments directed by John Hancorn
Sunday 17 September 2023
Headcorn Village Hall

The workshop will look at choruses from the Mass in B minor by Johann Sebastian Bach. The Mass is Bach's only setting of the complete Latin text of the mass and started as a much shorter version presented to the new Elector of Saxony in 1733 in the hope of impressing the new ruler. Towards the end of his life, mainly in 1748 and 1749, he finished composing new sections and compiling it into a complex, unified structure.

Open to the following instruments:

Violins, violas, cellos, double bass, 2 flutes, 2 oboes, 1 bassoon, 3 trumpets, keyboard. *Violin family players do not need to have a baroque instrument.* Tenor and bass viols also accepted to play the viola and bass parts.

Copies of parts will be available on the day. We will be using Bärenreiter orchestral parts and Novello vocal scores. (Both are on IMSLP if you wish to study them in advance – scroll down to find scores and parts - https://imslp.org/wiki/Mass in B minor, BWV 232 (Bach, Johann Sebastian)

Instrumentalists - please bring a stand. **Pitch** is A=440.

Fee: £18.00 for members of SEMF and other Fora and £24.00 for non-members.

He is Associate Lecturer in Choral Studies at the University of Chichester and a specialist examiner for Trinity Laban.
