Groupings will depend on the balance of applicants and available music. Pitch will be **A=440**.

- 'Double choir': consort music in eight or more parts
- Viol Consort
- Five-part recorder consort for Elizabethan music
- Broken consort
- 'Continuo room' for exploration of works for voice and obbligato instrument and/or trio sonatas
