The music: this workshop will focus on the music of Giovanni Croce (1557-1609), who was a leading Venetian composer of his day, together with Andrea and Giovanni Gabrieli. He worked at St Marks and became Assistant maestro di capella and then maestro di capella in 1603.

Croce's sacred music shows a development from the even-textured style of Palestrina to the more modern Venetian style of his day, using multiple choruses, solo voices, crisp instrumental rhythms, and basso continuo. We intend to include his 10-part Dialogo de Chori d'Angeli and movements of his 16-part Missa Jubilate Deo.

Open to all voices and the following instruments:

Cornetts, sackbuts, curtals/dulcians, recorders, viol and violin family, plucked continuo. *Violin family players do not need to have a baroque instrument.* Please bring a stand.

Copies of vocal scores and instrumental parts will be provided on the day. Pdfs of vocal scores will be available beforehand for singers to print or download to an ipad.

Acceptance is subject to musical balance.

He performs and records with many leading international groups and directors, such as *II Giardino Armonico*, *I'Arpeggiata, Concerto Copenhagen, Les Talens Lyriques, Concerto Italiano, Barokksolistene* and the *Nederlandse Bachvereniging*. Gawain is a member and co-director of *The English Cornett & Sackbut Ensemble*. His research and expertise in the field of ornamentation has also led to him becoming increasingly in demand as a coach for both singers and instrumentalists.
